

266 Main Street Water Break

On March 7th, reports of low water pressure and discolored water were received. Our water department staff responded swiftly and identified a significant water main break at 266 Main Street. Isolating the leak and implementing a temporary fix took some time. During this process, the direction of water flow was adjusted to ensure continued service to unaffected areas, which unfortunately caused temporary discoloration for many residents.

We appreciate the hard work of our dedicated staff and thank residents for their patience as we worked through the night to resolve the issue.

TRANSFER STATION:

Transfer Station Sticker Renewal:

2025-2027 Sticker Renewal Period – Starting May 5, 2025

To ensure continued access to the Transfer Station, please note the following details about the sticker renewal process:

Sticker Prices:

- 1st Sticker: \$125
- Additional Vehicles: \$30 per vehicle
- Out of Medfield Registration: \$100 surcharge (on top of sticker price) – Proof of Medfield residency required.

How to Obtain Your New Sticker:

- In-Person: Visit the DPW office during business hours.
- Mail-In Application: Mail your completed application to the DPW. Please allow 7 business days for processing and receipt of your sticker.
- Online: Apply for your sticker through the online portal. Please allow 7 business days for processing and receipt of your sticker.

Additionally, one Saturday each month from May to September, you will be able to apply for your sticker directly at the Transfer Station. Further details will be provided soon.

Important Reminder:

As of June 30, 2025, if you do not have the new 2025-2027 sticker, you may be denied entry to the Transfer Station. Be sure to renew your sticker before this deadline to avoid any disruption in service. For more information, feel free to contact the DPW office at 508-906-3003. Our staff is happy to assist you.

Office of
Transfer Station Permit Application
July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025

Access to the Transfer Station is limited to vehicles with a valid sticker issued by the Town. Stickers must be permanently affixed on the lower driver side windshield so as not to obstruct view, please see below diagram which is not to scale. Stickers must include the license plate # of the vehicle. Stickers are non-transferable and must remain on the vehicle for which it was purchased.

ELIGIBILITY:
Stickers may be issued to a lessee or a lessee's spouse if the lessee is a Medfield resident. Acceptable forms of proof include:
• Current Medfield Residential Address
• Insurance binder with the primary garaging address in Medfield

PRICES:
\$125.00 for first vehicle
\$30.00 for any additional vehicle at the same address
\$100.00 surcharge if vehicle is not from town of Medfield. (Must show proof of residency.)
Acceptable forms of proof of residency include proof of address and photo (e.g. utility bill or check payable to the Town of Medfield).
• Be present at the ground floor of Town Hall. (Please bring all documents with you to apply, see eligibility above.)
• Dropped off or mailed to: Town of Medfield DPW, 609 Main St, Medfield, MA 02052
(please attach a self-addressed, stamped envelope with all necessary documents. Copies of registrations will be discarded after review.)
• Online at town.medfield.net
Incomplete applications will not be processed until all required information is provided.





HIGHWAY PROJECTS:

Winter/Spring Cleanup



During the extended winter months of plowing operations, some damages may not be immediately visible and only become apparent once the spring thaw begins. As the snow melts, it reveals areas in need of repair, including curbing, grass strips, sidewalk sections, debris, and newly formed potholes. Our Highway Division inspects the town's roadways and shoulders, then schedules the necessary repairs as part of the preparations for the upcoming season.



Water Main Flushing




Town-wide hydrant flushing will begin Sunday, March 30th, 2025 and continue for a two week period. The work will be done at night to minimize any inconveniences. Some discoloration of water may occur during this process. This is caused by the water rushing through the pipes, disturbing sediments that have settled. We advise running the cold water tap for a few minutes until the water is clear. Visit the town's website to access the flushing schedule to see what approximate day we would be in your neighborhood.
