


Department of Public Works

- Don't forget about our Town House Drop Box! Located right on Janes Avenue for drive-up convenience. The drop box is emptied multiple times a day by authorized staff.



Facilities Department



- Medfield High School heating is provided via natural gas boilers that heat water that is then circulated throughout the 160,473 square foot building. Two 25 HP motors circulate the water through the school. Currently these motors are uncontrolled, running either 100% or off. This project will install variable frequency drives (VFDs) to control these two motors and moderate their performance, saving significant electricity. Modulating these two motors via VFDs is estimated to save 99,987 kWh annually. The total cost of the project was \$20,751 which was 100% covered by the DOER Green Communities Grant.

Trinity Financial Update

- Trinity received a second round of clarification requests from the Massachusetts Historical Commission after submitting in the April round for State Historic Tax Credits and are hopeful for a successful allocation. To answer these questions and finalize their permitting, the design team has been authorized to produce Design Development documents.
