Town Administrator's Office

- With special thanks to the Fire Chief, Board of Health, and our local delegation, Medfield now has 6 additional AED locations throughout town:

Town Clerk

- Every dog owned or kept within the Town of Medfield must be licensed annually by the owner or keeper prior to April 1st for the twelve month period beginning April 1st. Any person who fails to license their dog prior to April 1st shall pay a late fee of \$25 in addition to the dog licensing fee of \$10 (per dog)
- After July 1st, all unlicensed dog information will be forwarded to the animal control officer and violations will issued. The fine for owning or keeping an unlicensed dog shall be \$100 for each year that the dog is unlicensed.



Medfield Outreach

Trinity Financial Update

- Trinity successfully received Conditional Approval for its Part 2 Application to the National Park Service (NPS). This approval is a threshold requirement to qualify for the federal Historic Tax Credit. The team also met with the Mass Historic Commission (MHC) and the NPS to clarify comments provided by MHC on Trinity's January 2024 application. This week, the Town will submit an application for a second round of HousingWorks funding for proposed public infrastructure and Underutilized Properties Program funding to waterproof the buildings and preserve their structural elements.
