Town Administrator's Office

- The Town was notified on August 5th that the Attorney General has approved Town Meeting articles 5, 6, 7, 29, 31, 32, and 33
- We are currently hiring for a Director of Facilities, Conservation Agent/Environmental Planner, Firefighter/Paramedic and Clinician/Prevention Social Worker
- West Nile Virus and Eastern Equine Encephalitis Virus was confirmed in mosquitoes from Medfield. We continue to monitor the situation. For updates, please visit our Mosquito-Borne Disease page of the Board of Health website



Medfield Community Electricity

- The Medfield Community Electricity program went into effect after the Eversource June 2024 meter readings. On or about July 26th the July meter readings were taken and bills issued for the first 30 months with Direct Energy as our electricity supplier



Public Works

- An additional Big Belly Solar Compactor was installed on a sidewalk near the North Street Market
- Rehabilitation was completed on a portion of the Green Street Sidewalk

Parks and Recreation

- Hinkley Playground ribbon cutting and celebration will take place on Sunday, September 15 from 12-2pm. There will be music, face painting, local food establishments and more
- The Metacomet Tennis Courts light project is now complete and residents will be able to enjoy tennis in the evenings

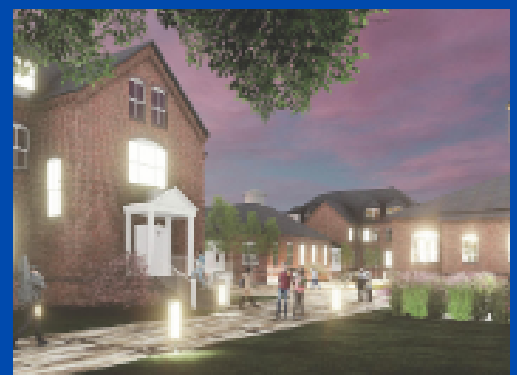


Outreach

Trinity Financial Update

- The MSH Development team has been diligently advancing both infrastructure and building design while coordinating closely with Town officials on various issues, including off-site intersections. Recently, the project secured its first allocation of state historic tax credits, with the Massachusetts Historical Commission awarding \$100,000 per building, totaling \$2.7 million. The team is preparing to submit another application for tax credits at the end of August
