- The next step is ICE Level 2 Review by MassDOT


Harding Street Intersections Under Review

- As part of the Trinity Financial Project at MSH, the following off-site intersections are being evaluated for design changes:
 - Harding/North
 - Harding/West
 - Harding/Hospital
- Design Options should be in front of the SB before the end of the year

Downtown Pedestrian Improvements

- Maria De La Fuente, Land Use Director, presented to the SB last month to kick off the downtown pedestrian improvement project that will include additional traffic calming measures and additional crosswalks
- Maria has applied for an additional grant from MassDOT for free Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons as part of this project
- The Federal Highway Safety Administration estimates that RRFBs can increase motorist yielding rates up to 98%.

Trinity Financial Update

The MSH Development team has been diligently advancing both infrastructure and building design while coordinating closely with Town officials on various issues, including off-site intersections. Recently, the project secured its first allocation of state historic tax credits, with the Massachusetts Historical Commission awarding \$100,000 per building, totaling \$2.7 million. The team is preparing to submit another application for tax credits at the end of August

COA GARAGE Next Steps

- Once the location has been finalized, final plans and an RFP to choose a contractor will be developed.

Free Covid Tests Available

The Administration for Strategic Preparedness and Response (ASPR), an agency within the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, in collaboration with the U.S. Postal Service has reopened COVIDtests.gov so that households across the country can order four additional over-the-counter COVID-19 tests for free. These tests are intended for use throughout the 2024 holiday season to detect currently circulating COVID-19 variants.

Town House Window Grant Awarded (\$61,000)

The Healey-Driscoll Administration today awarded \$1.75 million in Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) competitive subgrants to 45 municipalities across Massachusetts to fund 29 clean energy initiatives that help municipalities meet their own climate goals and share the benefits of climate action equitably.
