

FY27 BUDGET

FY2027 Budget Development Underway

The Town of Medfield is actively preparing the FY2027 Annual Budget, a multi-month process that supports essential town services, school operations, and long-term financial planning.

Budget development began in fall 2025, with budget information and updates posted on the Town's website.

Early projections estimate:

As of January 27, the FY27 Forecasted Revenue was **\$76,015,047**, allowing for a **1.8% increase** over FY26 for Town and School Operating Budgets.

2026 ANNUAL TOWN ELECTION

Monday, March 30, 2026

The following positions are open for nomination:

- **One Select Board member** for a term of three years
- **One Moderator** for a term of three years
- **One Assessor** for a term of three years
- **Two School Committee** members for a term of three years
- **Two Library Trustees** for a term of three years
- **One Planning Board** member for a term of five years
- **Two Parks and Recreation Commissioner** for a term of three years
- **One Housing Authority** member for a term of four years



Nomination papers are available at the Town Clerk's Office starting on December 15, 2025.

(1st floor of Town House). Nomination papers require 50 signatures of Medfield registered voters per candidate and are due back to the Town Clerk's office by **February 2, 2026 at 5:00 pm.**

Please note that last day to register to vote for this election is Friday, March 20, 2026 at 5:00pm.

2026 Annual Town Census

The Town Clerk's Office will mail the **2026 Annual Town Census** to Medfield households during the first part of the New Year. Residents are encouraged to complete and return the census promptly to ensure town records remain accurate and up to date.

The census is required by **Massachusetts General Law (Chapter 51, Section 4)** and is used by the Board of Registrars to verify and update the name, address, age, and occupation of all residents three years of age and older in preparation for the Annual Street List.

Please note: Completing the census does not register you to vote.

Completed census forms may be returned by mail or placed in the drop box located behind Town Hall.

Dog License Information (Included with Census)

The 2026 Annual Town Census will include a dog license application.

To obtain a dog license, residents must submit:

- Proof of a current rabies vaccination
- A \$10 check made payable to the Town of Medfield
- A self-addressed, stamped envelope so the license can be mailed back to you

2025 YEAR IN REVIEW

In 2025, the Medfield Fire Department responded to a total of **1,688 incidents**, reflecting the continued high demand for emergency services across the community. Of these calls, **972 were emergency medical and rescue responses**, making up **58%** of all responses, and **716 were fire-related calls** including structure fires, hazardous conditions, and alarms.



Winter Stormwater Reminder: Salt & Deicing

As winter weather continues, residents are reminded that snow and ice management practices can impact local waterways. Salt, sand, and other deicing materials that enter storm drains flow directly to rivers and streams without treatment. To help protect water quality, residents and property managers are encouraged to shovel early and often, use salt only where surfaces are icy or slippery, avoid piling snow near storm drains, and sweep up excess salt once ice has melted. Small actions taken during winter storms can make a meaningful difference in protecting Medfield's waterways.

Medfield Receives **\$4.5 Million** Additional State Grant

The Town of Medfield is excited to announce that the Healey-Driscoll Administration has awarded Medfield an **additional \$4.5 million** through the FY26 HousingWorks Infrastructure Program (HWIP) to support the Medfield State Hospital Redevelopment Project.

This increase brings Medfield's total FY26 award to \$5.5 million. With three consecutive HWIP awards in FY24, FY25, and FY26, the Commonwealth has now provided a total of \$10,486,600 in infrastructure funding to help advance this important redevelopment effort.

Offsite Construction Notice: Intersection Improvements

The Town of Medfield would like to inform residents of upcoming roadway and utility work in the Hospital Road area near the Medfield State Hospital campus.

Construction will take place at intersections involving **Hospital Road**, including connections with **Harding Street, Cottage Street, and Stonegate Drive**. Work may include excavation, utility installation, and roadway restoration.

Construction is expected to continue through **April 10, 2026**, with work generally occurring **Monday-Friday, 7:00 AM-4:00 PM**, weather permitting.

Residents may notice construction vehicles, noise, dust, and traffic delays. Access to certain roadways or intersections may be temporarily closed during work. The Town and its contractors will work to minimize disruptions.

Over 50 students, parents, Town leaders, and community members attended the Medfield Photovoice gallery on January 22nd, showcasing students' artistic works with their reflective captions designed to inspire dialogue and promote understanding of student perspectives on students' photographic reflections on the many positive and negative health influences in their everyday surroundings. Attendees also heard musical accompaniment from the Medfield Guitar Club as well as spoken reflections from MCAP coordinator Krissy King and MHS junior Christopher Unger.

The project was the culmination of a months-long collaboration between Medfield Outreach/Medfield Cares About Prevention (MCAP), Medfield High School, the Bellforge Arts Center, and Medfield TV. Students were trained in the fundamentals of risk and protective factors and had the opportunity to receive a free professional photography lesson before embarking on the project.
